Job Overview

The Maseno University Future of Sexual and Reproductive Health Research (FOR) Kenya **Intern** will work as a Program Coordinator under the direction of Dr. Ndunyu to ensure successful implementation of the FOR Kenya training activities, including but not limited to:

- Support day-to-day programmatic operations of FOR Kenya;
- Assist with compiling and finalizing training materials;
- Develop a scholar manual covering certificate program and training expectations;
- Facilitate recruitment of trainees;
- Coordination of weekly trainings (online and face-to-face) manage program logistics e.g. scheduling, procurement;
- Deliver select lectures and facilitate select seminars;
- Assist with developing MEL materials and implementing MEL activities, including analysis;
- Coordination of Mentorship and Research and Writing workshops;
- Ensure trainees are adequately supported to implement successful studies;
- Organize field visits as relevant;
- Any other assigned duties.

Future of Reproductive Health (FOR) Kenya Training Program

The Future of Sexual and Reproductive Health Research (FOR) Kenya Program at Maseno University in the School of Public Health and Community Development is a 12month pilot certificate program that will train older adolescent girls interested in developing careers in sexual and reproductive health research by designing and conducting their own innovative qualitative research studies with focus on improving the quality of SRH services for adolescents girls and young women.
